

PUBLIC HEALTH TECHNICIAN I

The Chautauqua County Department of Health is currently accepting applications for the title of Public Health Technician I for the Jamestown, NY office. A Public Health Technician I is a trainee position in the competitive class for which candidates are selected on the basis of general intelligence, academic knowledge of natural science, math and the ability to learn the basic principles, techniques and practices of environmental health inspection. The term of appointment is limited to one year. Promotion to the position of Public Health Technician II will follow without further examination upon successful completion of the training period. This is elementary, technical environmental health work involving responsibility for learning and assisting in the technical inspection work of the environmental health program in the County Health Department. The work is performed under close supervision, direction and instruction of a Public Health Engineer, Sanitarian and/or Public Health Technician. Does related work as required.

Typical Work Activities:

- Performs study and reading assignments;
- Observes demonstrations and otherwise learns environmental health inspection techniques and practices;
- Learns and assists in making inspections related to environmental health programs; Performs increasingly responsible duties as assigned.

This position is being filled on a provisional basis pending the outcome of a future dated Civil Service examination for this title.

Minimum Qualifications: Satisfactory completion of 60 semester credit hours from a regionally accredited or New York State registered college or university with a minimum of 15 credit hours in the natural sciences, of which not more than six (6) credit hours may be in the applied sciences, and satisfactory completion of a public health training course approved by the State Health Department within two years of appointment.
